Thruxton Parish Newsletter - March 2024

A warm welcome to the March edition of village newsletter. Sadly, weather continues to protest against the Every arrival of Spring but we live in hope for Wednesday warmer and drier days - especially drier days! - ahead.

Despite the inclement weather, there has been plenty of activity in the village, most notably with Southern Water (SW) continuing their planned sealing of the drains. sewer pipes and Thankfully, this is now complete and the road closures and traffic lights have 29th March departed to other villages in the catchment area. Interestingly, the work 31st March is having a major impact on the "flow" through the pumping stations that has enabled a significant reduction in the number of tankers in the village, despite continuing high levels of groundwater.

We would also like to draw your attention to the TVBC Draft Local Plan 2040 which is out for public consultation until 2nd April. We have enclosed a leaflet about the Draft Plan with this newsletter and we encourage you to engage with the consultation as it is your chance to have a say on how the area in which we live will develop over the coming 16 years. The Plan lays out where the major house building projects are likely to be sited as well as the development of new employment areas such as the Industrial Estate on the airfield. It's a big document but well worth looking at.

On the subject of planning, we are awaiting the Planning Officer's decision with respect to the application to build 14 affordable houses on land Stanbury Close. As was reported last there were well over 80 individual from comments residents and we are hopeful that the over-whelming expression of negative

Thruxton Parish Council Meeting – 4th March 2024

The Parish Council met, as usual on the first Monday of the month, The full minutes will appear on the website and noticeboards in due course but the key points covered in the meeting included:

- A short talk from Simon Bowder regarding the references in TVBC's Draft Local Plan 2040 for development of the airfield Industrial Estate, following which he answered questions from residents.
- A member of the public asked if the Parish Council would remind residents of their responsibility to keep hedges trimmed back from paths and footpaths. Although it is now bird nesting season, residents should endeavour to keep their hedges from restricting paths.
- A tree has been purchased and will be planted on the Village Green in commemoration of contributions to the community of John Davis who died last year.
- Following receipt of contributions from Kimpton and Fyfield Parish Councils, a contract has been signed for the grass cutting on the Sports Field through the remainder of this year.
- The next meeting will be on Monday 8th April (the first Monday being a bank holiday) at 7:30pm in the Memorial Hall.

Thruxton Down Farm - Update

The owner has created a yard for lorries and trailers on an agricultural site without consent. Many residents reported the dangerous entrance and unfortunately there was a fatality on the road outside the site in August 2023. An Enforcement Notice was issued by TVBC Planning during the last week of February 2024 requiring the site to cease storage of vehicles and trailers, close the repair shop and remove the hard standing and bund. The owners have 28 days from the notice to respond either to accept or appeal. The Case Officer believes they will probably appeal. The appeal process is likely to take a number of months as there is a large backlog of appeals in the system. If the appeal is rejected then enforcement will proceed. The owners then will have 4 months to comply. Unfortunately the wheels of justice are slow but at least we have an end in sight.

The Parish Council will keep you informed of progress and keep focussed on unapproved and illegal activity in our Parish.
