Thruxton Parish Newsletter - January 2023

I have a couple of items to share with you this month. Firstly, you may be aware that we have local elections on 4th May this year which means that you have the opportunity to vote for both TVBC and Parish Councillors. If you need a special Voter Authority Certificate (VAC) you can apply at no cost to voterauthority-certificate.service.gov.uk from Monday 16th January. We will be posting more information in the coming weeks onto the Thruxton Village website and there will also be information issued by TVBC, so please keep your eyes peeled – we do not want you to lose your ability to vote.

Southern Water (SW) Update

Relining of the Thruxton Sewer network starts 30 January 2023

SW is scheduled to start relining the sewer pipes in Thruxton on Monday 30 January. This is part of an ongoing relining programme to tackle groundwater infiltration in the Pillhill Brook catchment area. The work involves relining both public private sewers. SW took the decision to fund relining of private sewer pipes because about 42% of our sewer network is made up of privately owned pipes. During groundwater season, when groundwater levels are high, these private pipes make a significant contribution to the groundwater infiltration that threatens to SW's overwhelm water pumping stations. The work is focussed on the villages Kimpton, northern of Thruxton, Fyfield and East Cholderton to reduce the cumulative effects of infiltration further down the catchment and the work on privately owned pipes will commence later in the Spring.

SW's contractor Cappagh Brown Utilities Ltd (CBUL) have completed the relining work in Kimpton and now move into Thruxton. CBUL are using a product called Tubogel which involves two tankers containing different fluids that react with each other to form a watertight seal along each pipe. Whilst SW and CBUL will make every effort to keep disruption to a minimum the relining work required along Village Street will require width restrictions and road closures. SW will be working closely with Peter Christie and the Pan Parish Forum (PPF) to make sure that residents of the village are kept informed of both road closures and the progress being made to complete the relining program. The Pan Parish Forum is made up of representatives from Kimpton, Thruxton, Fyfield, from Amport, Monxton, Quarley, Abbotts Clatford Ann and Upper Parish Councils. John Davis writes - I have been invited to write an article for the January Newsletter, and thought I would pen something a little different as we have space and there is no Parish Council meeting to summarise.

We arrived in the village in April 1971. Lambourne Way had 12 houses, all built by Dunnings. Where numbers 14-20 stand today was a green field on the Andover side and a copse with running spring on the other. One of my first undertakings was to hold a bonfire and firework display on the field - at that time, we hadn't learned to be worried about the thatch on adjacent properties!

I was invited to join the Hall Committee by the Chairman, Alf Machin. I agreed,

but as a serving military officer, would not get embroiled in village politics. At our first January meeting the Committee was debating whether or not the vicar should be allowed to use the Hall for his Christmas Sale because he hadn't swept up after the last one. The debate had to be heard to be believed and it became very lively !!. The voting was 3-3 so I was asked to cast my vote. I refused, this was village politics so I would abstain. I persuaded the Chairman to vote for the status quo, so the vicar was allowed to continue to use the Hall.

There was racing every Saturday and Sunday at the Circuit, but the Protection Society, was fighting a High Court battle to have this reduced. The High Court recommended 8 noisy days each year but the Minister (Wedgwood Benn) allowed 12; however, he was swiftly overruled by the Court and the Circuit is limited to the agreed number of race days to this day.

On the airfield, additional to racing and normal airfield operations, there was a gliding club, a parachute club and other activities. There was a very nasty accident one Sunday on the airfield resulting in the death of a parachutist so this was curtailed.

There was a field behind our house with horses grazing – this subsequently became Stanbury Close as it is today. The Conservation Area was set aside in the early 70s and remains where it is today.

We had two shops - Ann Gerrish had a

Sadly, this has left the village with no local shop.

The Sports Field was part of Henry Pelham's estate (Henry owns the Airfield) and he kindly donated it to the Parish Council. Thanks to the sterling work of a number of villagers, it is now managed by the Three Villages Sports Trust and the field is protected by the Fields in Trust organisation which means that it can never be used for anything other than recreation for the three villages.

Lovell Close and Halcyon Drive were built ahead of Lambourne Way with Lambourne Close in 1974 as soon as mains drainage was extended Thruxton Down was built later and there has been little infilling elsewhere to get the village to its current shape. We have seen many changes over the 50+ years we have been in Thruxton but it remains a wonderful community to live in.
