Thruxton Parish Newsletter - September 2023

Hello once again. I hope you've enjoyed the summer break and are enjoying the current spell of warm, sunny weather – isn't it strange that we get these beautiful days just as the holiday season finishes?!

Back in July, we were delighted to be told that TVBC had refused the planning application to build 14 affordable homes on land off Stanbury Close and thank everyone who made objections to this application. The Parish Council fully expect the developer – Orchard Homes – to come back yet again with a revised application and we will remain vigilant to ensure we have the opportunity to assess any revised application against the needs and wishes of the community. We have been advised that it is likely that a revised application will be made in the coming weeks to change the permitted use of the barn on Thruxton Down Road; following the recent fatal accident there, where a motor-cyclist ran into the back of a stationary lorry waiting to enter the site, we remain implacably opposed to anything that would result in more vehicles using this site.

We would like to thank everyone for their patience and forbearance over the past few weeks as Southern Water have been working on the main sewer pipe running through the village. The road closure around The White Horse will end on Friday 8th September and SW will move the focus of their work to Monxton. However, they will be back later this month when they will be working on the sewer beneath Village Street and Stanbury Road. Once the details of timing and impact on roads are known we will put an announcement on Facebook and the Thruxton Village website to let everyone know what is happening and how your travel will be

Some members of the community will be aware that Kimpton, Thruxton and Fyfield Primary School were inspected by Ofsted in late May. In recent months, the Thruxton Loves Cake (TLC) coffee morning each Wednesday in the Memorial Hall has become a popular meeting place for a growing number of people. Huge thanks are due to the people responsible for providing this opportunity to chat with neighbours and friends – Janet Mitchell, Brenda Jarman and Louise Cushine plus

their army of cake-makers. It's well worth a visit!

Sadly, one of the regulars at TLC and long-time resident of Thruxton – Connie Moss – passed away at the beginning of the month. We send our condolences to her family. The flag on the Green was flown at half-mast last Saturday and Sunday and will do so again when her memorial service takes place (date to be advised).

Finally, celebrations to mark the 80th anniversary of D-Day are being planned across the country for 6th June 2024. If anyone wishes to organise a commemoration in Thruxton – including lighting the beacon that we acquired for the Queen's 70th Jubilee celebrations – please would you contact me and I can put you in touch with the national organiser.

Parish Council Meeting

The Parish Council met on the evening of Monday 4th September and covered a wide range of topics. As usual, the full minutes will be posted on the Council notice-boards and the website, but the key items covered included:

- An update from Cllr. Munday on re-wilding various parts of land including part of the Village Green, land close by the sub-station and (possibly) verges of Thruxton Down Road. He also commented that the wildlife survey didn't raise a great deal of interest so attention will turn to assessing the number and type of endangered species that can be seen in the Parish.
- The Parish Council has paid for the installation of a dog waste bin at the entrance to the path that runs off Dauntsey Lane toward Fyfield. Residents had complained about the lack of such a facility and the mess along the path. We hope the bin will help to solve this issue.
- Cllr. Christie gave an update on the Southern Water operations in the village

and the need for road closure around The White Horse. He has been advised that the work will end on 8th September but will return to the village later this month. Further updates will be shared once the plans have been finalised.

- The Clerk reported on the installation of speed warning signs in the village and the data that is now being analysed. If anyone would like to see the data please contact Heather Bourner - (clerk@thruxtonparishcouncil.com). We have data from the sign on Stanbury Road by the Elm Close junction and it shows that the vast majority of people drive past at less than 30mph (average speed around 23mph) apart from a small number of incidents when cars have been measured at speeds of 45mph and one case of 54mph. The data also provides the number of vehicles passing which will be useful information when it comes to looking at the suitability of our road network.
- Cllr. Cotterill has investigated First Aid training and identified a provider who is cheaper than St. John's Ambulance. We will go ahead and arrange a date for the training and notify those people who have asked to be trained.
- The Council had a long discussion regarding the recent fatal accident on Thruxton Down Road and determined that the Chair would write to the Head of Planning at TVBC to enquire about the enforcement of planning regulations on the owner of Thruxton Down Farm and the reduction in the risk of a further serious road accident at this spot.
- HCC Cllr. Donnelly reported that the possible re-organisation of Hampshire CC will not now proceed. He also mentioned the extensive programme of pot-hole repairs that is on-going as well as the County Council's decision to ban the sale of single use vapes.
- Community thanks were noted for the team who provide the TLC coffee morning each Wednesday and to Edward Chamberlain for clearing the stream bed of vegetation in readiness for Hampshire Highways to repair the wall alongside the Village Green.
- The next meeting will be on Monday 2nd October at 7:30pm in the Memorial Hall.

Connie Moss

We were saddened to learn of the death of long-time resident Connie Moss. Her friend Jan Lawrence writes:

Connie passed away on Saturday 2nd September.

She first came to Thruxton in the early 70's to work in the Civil Service in Andover. Connie soon became involved in village activities when several people got chatting in the George pub (as it was then) about The Queen's upcoming Silver Jubilee. The group decided to organise a tea party for all the children with a celebration mug and perhaps some games and races - but where could this take place? The Glebe Field gave permission and a successful day was had by all, including the adults who enjoyed a disco in the evening.

When the Village Association was formed, Connie joined the Committee and helped to raise money to purchase the Glebe Field - now our beautiful Village Green - from the Church.


Connie was very active with The Thruxton Players. She was in most of the plays - who remembers Dicky the Plumber? In the annual panto she always played the Fairy, good or bad - when playing the Bad Fairy if she didn't get at least 2 children in tears then she wasn't doing her job!

When our precious Georgian Grade II listed Memorial Hall was in desperate need of expensive renovation, it was decided to apply for a Lottery Grant. Connie was on the Committee at the time and over the following 6 years, many forms were completed until a

Heritage Lottery grant of £500,000 was awarded. In the meantime, Connie "encouraged" many people onto the Committee to arrange builders and to send begging letters for kitchen equipment, chairs, curtains, stage furniture, etc. During this time, Connie became Chair of the Memorial Hall Trustees and, once the Hall was up and running again (some 2 years later), she handed over the Chair with the satisfaction of a job very well done.

Connie "retired" and concentrated upon her beloved cruising - happy times with loads of fun, laughter and those ironing boards.....!

There will be a memorial service in the Church in due course - date to be advised.




