Thruxton Parish Newsletter - April 2022

Welcome once again to Thruxton Times - the newsletter for all residents of Thruxton. It's been another busy month, especially on the planning front (see more below), but I join with my fellow Councillors in wishing a relaxing and happy Easter to everyone in the community.

On the planning front, we now have 2 important applications lodged with TVBC. The application to build 26 houses on land off Stanbury Close has been extended to allow time for further statutory consultations to be held - we now understand that the application is open until 6th May. In recent days, the developers have lodged their response to the numerous objections that have been raised by you and other bodies (Highways, Archaeology, etc); their rebuttals of our objections have been forcefully challenged by some residents - notably Mrs Bryden and Messrs Windsor, Counsell and Watt - and the Parish Council have lodged their endorsement and total support to the resident's latest objections and comments. We understand that our local Borough Councillor, Cllr. Phil Lashbrook, remains committed to taking the application to the Northern Area Planning Committee if the Planning Department in TVBC approve the application. It continues to be a case of "watch this space". Residents interested in reading more detail can refer to the TVBC Planning website and follow application reference 22/00033/OUTN.

The other major planning application that is now open is for the creation of 9 self-build houses on land at the end of Lambourne Close - the reference for this application is 22/00768/OUTN. The Parish Council have already committed to holding a public meeting to allow residents to discuss this application and inform the Council of their views - this will be held in The Memorial Hall on Thursday 21st April at 7:30pm.

You may be aware that TVBC is updating the local plan - this will guide the development of the Test Valley Council area for the next 18 years to 2040. The Plan focuses on how the area will grow - including where new houses might be built, how the economy will be developed and how the environment and quality of life will be enhanced. To learn

They have removed a load of dead shrubbery, ivy and other weeds and erected a fence to keep the Green safe for children and dogs; the cleared area will be planted up with new plants, shrubs and bulbs in due course but, in the meantime, we hope you enjoy the tidier look to the Green.

The Parish Council hope you have an enjoyable, relaxing and happy Easter weekend and that you and your families keep safe and healthy.

Parish Council Meeting – Wed. 6th April

The Parish Council met, as usual, on the first Wednesday of the month and the key points that were discussed were:

- Annual Assembly – after 2 years without an Assembly due to the pandemic, we agreed that we should call an Assembly in May. We discussed the format of the Assembly and who to invite as speakers and agreed to hold the meeting on May 4th following the scheduled Parish Council meeting – further details to follow.
- Councillors agreed that the layby on Village Street at the eastern end of the village (opposite the allotments) should be retained. Residents living in the immediate vicinity had requested that the Council support them in their desire to see the layby retained and this has been communicated to Hampshire Highways.
- Cllr. Durant reported that several potential sites for speed warning signs have

been identified around the village and that we are awaiting approval of these sites from Hampshire Highways. Once this is received we will purchase the posts and the signs – an allowance of £8,000 has been made in this year's budget. The signs will need to be periodically moved to different places in the Village – if you would like to help with this responsibility please contact the Parish Clerk, Heather Bourner.

- TVBC Cllr. Lashbrook briefed the Council on community resilience and the CERT programme that he leads for TVBC. The Council agreed that it should resurrect the work that was started over 2 years ago to develop a plan for Thruxton as, despite having a very strong volunteering spirit in the village as witnessed at the time of the flash flood and cottage fire in 2020, we have no formal framework to activate a response and to support the emergency services. Cllr. Lashbrook promised to share some sample templates that could be used to help develop a plan for Thruxton.
- The Clerk reported that HSBC have started to charge the Council £8 per month plus transaction fees for providing banking services. Following her research, she recommended to the Council that the accounts should be transferred to Lloyds and all Councillors agreed.

- Cllr. Davis reported that the Council had raised no objections to planning applications for tree works at The Moorings, Stanbury


- The Council agreed to change the planned July meeting date from 6th July to 27th July to accommodate personal commitments of 2 members of the Council.
