Hi - and thanks for reading the May edition of the village newsletter. On behalf of the Parish Council, I hope you all enjoyed the Coronation weekend, whatever you were doing and despite the challenges that the weather gave us.

Many of you will be aware of the sad passing of our Vice Chair, John Davis at the end of April. We send our condolences to Margaret and the family. A tribute from Steve Counsell appears later in the newsletter.

We had the local elections on 4th May at which 4 Councillors were elected unopposed – Peter Christie, Tricia Harris, Richard Munday and Will Odling. At the AGM on 10th May, Peter Christie was elected to continue as Chair and Richard Munday was elected Vice Chair. Will Odling will move onto the Planning team with Tricia Harris but it means we are looking to co-opt 3 people onto the Council. If you are interested in this opportunity to support the community, please contact me.

Many of you will be aware that there is a new planning application to build 14 houses on land off Stanbury Close. We have until Friday 19th May to lodge our comments on the TVBC website. Following a long and detailed discussion at the Parish Assembly on 10th May the Parish Council will follow the views of the residents who attended and object to the application; however, we need as many residents as possible to lodge their comments and we urge you to make your views known before the deadline.

I will keep my introduction relatively brief this month as we have plenty of other articles to fit in. Enjoy the Spring weather and we hope for warmth and few showers over the coming weeks.

Parish Council AGM and Parish Assembly – 10th May 2023

The Parish Council held its AGM which was deliberately kept brief to allow time for the Parish Assembly which followed. At the AGM the following key decisions were taken:

• Peter Christie was re-elected as Chair and Richard Munday elected as Vice Chair.

• We confirmed the core processes that determine how we conduct PC business – standing orders, code of conduct, financial procedures and Councillor responsibilities.

• Councillors approved the purchase of speed warning signs which will be fixed in prominent positions around the village to address the concerns of many regarding cars travelling through the village in excess of the speed limit.

• Cllr. Odling confirmed that the resurfacing of St. John's Lane will proceed when we have a longer spell of dry weather and the puddles dry out.

At the Parish Assembly which followed the AGM we were pleased to welcome guest speakers Ben Taylor from the race circuit, Ian Hickman, Executive Head Teacher of

Skylark Federation which includes Kimpton, Thruxton and Fyfield Primary School and Graham Harris representing the Trustees of the Memorial Hall. All 3 guests gave interesting summaries of their activities over the last year and plans for the future.

We congratulated Cllr. Chris Donnelly and Cllr. Phil Lashbrook on their re-elections and were pleased to learn that Hampshire Highways is proceeding with their programme of pothole repairs and that TVBC will be introducing a new refuse collection system, to include plastics and bottles, by the end of the year.

The Assembly then discussed the application to build 14 houses on land off Stanbury Road (see introduction) following which the meeting closed and attendees were invited to enjoy drinks with members of the Parish Council.

Our next meeting will be on Monday 5th June at 7:30pm in the Memorial Hall. Please note all future meetings will be on the first Monday of the month (excluding January and August).

I first met "Field Marshall" John Davis when preparing for a Village Fete in the late 1980s. He was never an Army man but served his country in the Royal Air Force and his Village in many, many ways. His RAF career as a Test Pilot took him, Margaret and their family to many bases around the world, including a stint as Air Attaché behind the Iron Curtain and he attained the rank of Wing Commander. After his RAF days he continued his aviation interests by working for the Civil Aviation Authority to keep flying displays and the public safe, also editing and proof reading a range of aviation publications.


John was a Parish Councillor for almost 50 years. He served as Chair and Vice Chair of the Council and led on Planning issues. His words still ring true in the Village Appraisal and Village Design Statement. He was even addressing Planning problems at his last Parish Council meeting in April. The Parish is a better place for his attention to detail.

In the Memorial Hall he managed the Flower and Produce Show and, his proudest achievement, instigated the Quiz and Chips nights . He was involved in the 2003 major refurbishment of the Hall. He successfully shouldered the burden of applying for various grants to fund the project. He helped the Village Association with the Fete until younger help took over. John was a forthright man but was unfailingly polite and respected the right of others to hold a different view to his.

His was a lifetime of service, impossible to sum up in a few words. He will be missed not only by Margaret and their family, our deepest and fondest sympathies are with them, but also by the Parish. A Memorial Service will be held in the Church on the 9th June 2023 at 3:00 pm followed by a gathering in the Memorial Hall.


