Thruxton Parish Newsletter - February 2024

The snowdrops are out – spring is on its way! We hope you all enjoyed the Christmas period and that the new year has started out positively for you and your families.

wanted to open this month's newsletter by acknowledging the years of service to the village community by Tricia Harris. Tricia has stepped down from her role as Parish Councillor after 5 years dedicated and committed work in a variety of roles; she was always one of the first to volunteer to help people in need and her steadfast support and common sense has invaluable to the Council in general and to me in particular. We shall miss her sage contributions to our discussions but know that she will continue to contribute to the village, albeit in a less formal manner. We wish her a long and healthy "retirement" from the Parish Council.

I would also like to thank all those who have spent time to comment on the planning application to build houses on the land off Stanbury Close. Due to some arcane bureaucratic reason, the window for comment is open until 14th February but as of today (5th Feb.) there have been over 80 comments from residents, which is an amazing testimony to the strength of feeling about this matter from across the community – on behalf of the Parish Council, a very big thank you to everyone. We await the outcome with interest!

Still on planning matters, the TVBC Local Plan 2040 is out for consultation until 2nd April 2024. This document is a key framework for determining how communities across TVBC will evolve over the coming 16 years so, whatever your attitude towards local government might be, it will have a big impact on us. on Monday 5th March.

For example, there is a proposal for the development of the industrial estate on Thruxton Airfield and for large-scale housing development on the edge of Ludgershall (1,500 houses to be built). Finally, you may be aware that Henry Pelham has recently sold the airfield. The new owner is Alex Thistlethwaite, who lives in Chute and is a historic car racing enthusiast. We hope to invite Alex to our annual village meeting in May but in the meantime, I'm pleased to share that Henry's representative, Bowder, will be at the next Parish Council meeting to speak about the plans for the industrial estate and to answer questions. All residents are welcome – the meeting starts at 7:30pm

Parish Council Meeting -5th February 2024

The Parish Council held its first meeting of the year on 5th February. As usual, minutes will appear on noticeboards and the website in due course but the key items discussed included:

- A farewell to Tricia Harris who is stepping down from the Parish Council but we welcomed Becky Sherlock to the Council. Becky spent most of her childhood in the village and returned to live in Thruxton 3 years ago and is looking forward to contributing to the continued development of Thruxton.
- We acknowledged the support from Hampshire Highways in clearing the flooded roads along Village Street, caused by the very high groundwater levels following heavy rainfall in December. However, their continued failure to address the collapsing wall alongside the Village Green was also noted and the Chair committed to seek urgent solutions through Hampshire CC Cllr. Donnelly.
- The Clerk summarised the data being reported from the speed cameras in the village and told Councillors that the camera on Stanbury Road (by Elm Close) will be turned round shortly so that it faces downhill and measures the speed of vehicles driving north, up Stanbury Road.
- Councillors approved the purchase of water testing equipment to assess and monitor water quality in Pilhill Brook. This is part of a wider initiative by the Pan-Parish Forum across the Pilhill Brook area.
- Volunteers are sought to help with the layout and distribution of the Thruxton Times. Anyone interested in becoming involved should contact Peter first Christie the instance | in (pchristie@thruxtonparishcouncil.com).
- The Council approved a grant of Hall. £500 to assist the Three Villages Sports Field Trust maintain the field through

grass cutting and tidying. Similar grants have been given by Kimpton and Fyfield but the Trustees will need to contribute an additional £800 to meet the costs of upkeep.

- The Chair announced that the Draft Local Plan 2040 has just been published by TVBC. It includes proposals for how all areas in the Borough will develop over the coming years, including housing developments to the east of Ludgershall and growth in the Thruxton Airfield industrial estate. The public consultation is open from 6th February to 2nd April and all residents are encouraged to read and comment on the Draft Plan.
- It was agreed to conduct a Housing Needs Survey for Thruxton with the survey questions designed to meet our specific needs - i.e. we will not use a TVBC pro-forma survey. Volunteers are sought to assist with this important exercise from questionnaire design, data gathering through to analysis.
- Community thanks were recorded to Jason Bailey for his help in digging culverts to help mitigate the road flooding as well as helping to clear away a fallen tree on Stanbury Road.
- The next meeting will be held on Monday 4th March at 7:30pm in the Memorial Hall.

From Thruxton **Memorial Hall**

Happy New Year to You All!

Do you have any ideas for activities that you would like to see happen in the Hall? Or perhaps know someone who would like to run a class or an event of some sort? Please direct them to me, Gill Odling on 07789145817. We are very keen to run more weekly events for the village.

In the Deed of Declaration the hall is held in trust "for the purposes of physical and mental training and recreation and social religious moral and intellectual development through the medium of reading and recreation rooms library lectures classes recreations and entertainments and otherwise as may be found expedient for the benefit of the inhabitants of the Parish of Thruxton". As Trustees we are charged with spending all our income on maintaining the Hall for these purposes.

At the moment we are marketing the hall to a wider audience, trying to make enough income to cover the costs of maintaining it whilst keeping a discounted local rate.

As examples of the challenges involved: Some time ago we realised that our heaters were failing. After much thought and discussion we had new heating installed in the main Hall at the beginning of November. The toilets require decorating and a little maintenance. The Kitchen will require a larger sum of money so please read the info about the promises Auction on the 29th June and consider an offering if you can, however small.
