Where has the year gone? It seems only last week that I was preparing for New Year 2024 and yet, here we are getting ready for Christmas.

It's been a busy month in the village with lots going on. As we wrote last month, the planning issues on land at the edge of the village have been uppermost in the Parish Councillor's minds. We submitted our comments to the Planning Inspectorate regarding Orchard Homes' appeal against the refusal of planning permission to build behind Stanbury Close and now await completion of their review of the case we are told it could be anything between 30 and 60 weeks, so don't hold your breath. At the end of November, Foreman Homes held a meeting to share their design concepts for land at the end of Lambourne Way – I'm told it was a "robust" meeting in which 40 or so residents shared their views with a team from Foreman Homes. We await their next move.

A word of thanks to TVBC Cllr. Phil Lashbrook and his wife, Deputy Mayor will be who laying Wreath just before Remembrance Christmas at the Menin Gate in Ypres, Belgium on behalf of all those from local communities who gave their lives in the Great War. Thruxton is one of the Parishes named on the wreath.

We would like to add our more general thanks to TVBC Cllr. Lashbrook and to Hampshire Cllr. Chris Donnelly for all the support they have given to Thruxton over the last year. They have a thankless job of trying to please all the people all the time and we appreciate all their advice and encouragement that they provide to the Thruxton community. In our Council meeting on 2nd Dec. we recorded the community's specific thanks to 2 residents – Jason Bailey, for moving the speed signs to other

Parish Council Meeting

The Parish Council met on Monday 2nd December 2024 in the Memorial Hall. As usual full minutes will appear on Parish Notice Boards and the website but key issues discussed included:

- Flooding on Village Street though Hampshire Highways had carried out some work the problem persists. Cllr Christie will chase Hampshire Highways accentuating the potential risks from ice forming on the footpath.
- Speeding Cllr. Earp will arrange

locations in the village. Most of the speed awareness volunteers have received their training and suitable locations to operate will be confirmed. A hand held speed camera will be purchased by the Parish Council.

- Village Green a regular audit of trees on Parish Council land by a tree surgeon will be arranged. A number of overhanging branches will need work undertaken. Four red Copper Beech bare root trees have been reserved from the Hampshire Forest Partnership to be planted in front of the electricity substation on Lambourne Way.
- Land at the end of Lambourne Way the recent public presentation by Foreman Homes who are looking at submitting a planning application for 10 new homes was discussed. Residents raised a number of concerns and the developers hope of community support were challenged. The Council will await the next contact from the developer.
- Land off Stanbury Close regarding the appeal to the refused application for homes on the land adjacent to Stanbury Close, it was noted the deadline for public comments has passed and the decision from the planning inspectorate is likely to take between 30 and 60 weeks yes, really!!
- County Cllr. Donnelly reported that TVBC has initiated a winter fuel payment support scheme for pensioners on low income who are affected by the removal of the winter fuel supplement. He also referred the consideration to implementing a unitary authority with an appointed mayor that has been resurrected by the new government; this is likely to take a considerable time process given the size complexities of Hampshire.

There is no Parish Council meeting in January. The next Parish Council meeting will be held on Monday 3rd February 7.30pm in the Memorial Hall.

2025/26 Council Tax

The Parish Council are pleased to announce that there will be no increase in the Thruxton Parish Council precept in your Council Tax bills for the next financial year. After a full discussion at the meeting on 2nd December, it was decided that the Council has strong reserves and has managed to deliver a balanced budget for several years – i.e. our expenditures are in line with our income. As a consequence, we will not increase the amount you pay for the Parish Council.

Hampshire County Cllr. Chris Donnelly stated that the County is likely to increase Council Tax by 3% with a further 2% added to cover social care costs. A final decision on the precise amount will be made in the New Year.
