### Thruxton Parish Newsletter - June 2022

Greetings from the Parish Council. We hope you enjoyed the Jubilee weekend and managed to participate in some – if not all of the events that were arranged in the village to celebrate The Queen's magnificent Platinum Jubilee. Many of us were deeply involved in the celebrations which explains the late production and distribution of this month's newsletter – we hope the delay hasn't dis-orientated you too much!

First and foremost, we must thank everyone who was involved in contributing to the events over the Jubilee holiday weekend. Obviously, to name everyone would take pages and pages – and we'd inevitably miss someone out! So suffice it to say that you know what you did and we are all immensely grateful for the energy, creativity, resilience and selflessness which you have shown over the last 8 or 9 months that it has taken to organise and deliver the different events. Judging by comments I have received and seen on Facebook, everyone who attended an event enjoyed themselves and appreciated all the effort. Thank you!

Many of you will be aware that the planning application to build 26 houses on land off Stanbury Close has been withdrawn. We are very grateful for the huge number of people who submitted comments - overwhelmingly objecting to the proposal - and created such a significant set of hurdles to be overcome that the developer decided to retreat "tae think again" as the Scots put it. We are expecting that there will be another application submitted at some point in the future, so although the battle was won we have not won the war. A small group of residents have kindly volunteered their time to collate all the objections and comments so that our defences are fully prepared for the next application. On the other major application – for 9 self-build houses on land at the end of Lambourne Close – there is no news to report; the date for comments has passed and we await the decision of the Planning team at TVBC. Obviously, we hope that our objections have been taken into account and that the application will be refused, but we can only wait for the process to issue its conclusion. We have been and will be planning to repair these in the

advised by our TVBC Councillor, Phil Lashbrook, that if the application is is approved it will be reviewed at the Northern Area Planning Committee at which we will have the opportunity to voice our concerns. We will keep residents posted on how this develops.

We have been asked by Cllr. Phil Lashbrook to make sure we make our voices heard in the consultation period for the new TVBC Borough Plan later this year. The Plan is in the process of being prepared and will act as a focal point for planning matters for the coming 20 years, so this is the opportunity to influence how TVBC treat rural villages like Thruxton. The next stage of consultation (so-called Regulation 18, Stage 2) will be open later this year (late autumn) and at that time we will be asking you to make your comments and providing links to the Plan. Southern Water continue their "pathfinder" project to upgrade the sewage system in the area. You will have seen that tankers are frequently working around the village – this is to enable scans to be taken of the sewage pipes to identify where they need repairing and to keep the pipes clear while re-lining takes place. During the coming couple of months, SW will be surveying laterals (the pipes between your house and the main sewage pipe) to identify breaks and cracks where groundwater can get into the system

coming months. You should receive a letter from SW regarding this work in the near future.

Please note that the July edition of the newsletter will also be delayed – I am away at the start of July so we will aim to produce the newsletter after the first week of July and distribute over the following weekend.

In the meantime, we hope you enjoy the coming month and that we are blessed with fine and warm weather. Thanks for reading - Peter Christie.



#### Parish Council meeting – Wed 1st June 2022

As usual, the Parish Council met on the first Wednesday of the month – 1st June – and our key points of discussion were as follows:

• Sadly, Cllr. Leo McDevitt has resigned from the Council due to pressure of work. He has kindly agreed to continue his monthly check of the play equipment on the Sports Field but it does mean we're looking for a replacement Councillor. Anyone interested in applying should contact the Clerk, Heather Bourner (clerk@thruxtonparishcouncil.com)

• Cllr Munday reported that he's in discussion with County Councillor Chris Donnelly and Hampshire Highways to find ways to improve the speed signage on Thruxton Down Road. Cllr Durant was unable to attend the meeting so her report on speed control measures in the village was deferred to July.

• The Parish Council agreed in principle to support the Memorial Hall by funding the costs of purchasing a new oven. Consideration will need to be given to the source of the funds and a final decision reached in due course.

• The Clerk reported concerns from



several residents regarding over-flowing waste bins on the Sports Field and at the junction of Amesbury Road and Wiremead Lane. This has been reported to TVBC and the Council will ensure that the bins are fully connected to the stanchions to prevent large bags of waste being placed in the bins or the bins being used for fly tipping.

• The Council reviewed and approved the Planning Group's recommendations not to register any objections for applications for an extension, porch and changes to internal layout at Floral Villa; tree works at 15, Beech Close; and a certificate of lawfulness for a single story extension at 2, Lovell Close.

• Community thanks were noted for Edward Chamberlain for his work on the fence and hedges at the entrance to the Village Green; to Roger Oliver for his ongoing work to control weeds on the streambank and road verges; to Graham Harris for his work to spruce up the library phone box ahead of the Jubilee weekend; and to everyone who took the time to raise objections to the planning application to build 26 houses on land off Stanbury Close.

Please note the next meeting will be held at 7:30pm on Wed. 27th July in the Machin Room of the Memorial Hall.


