## **Thruxton Parish Newsletter - October 2023**

Hello and welcome to the October edition of our newsletter. It seems that the season of mists is upon us and I hope you've all been enjoying some mellow fruitfulness.

We're pleased to note that Southern water have completed their operations in the village and that the roads are open again. However, as we shared in last month's newsletter, there are plans to return and continue the sewer relining along Village Street and Stanbury Road. We haven't been notified of dates yet but will alert everyone via Facebook and the Thruxton Village website as soon as we know anything.

We have been told that Orchard Homes preparing a revised planning application to develop affordable homes on the land off Stanbury Close. This will be the fifth application in the short time that I have lived in the village so I guess one has to admire their persistence! Once the application has been received we will, of course, notify everyone and I'm sure we will all mobilise yet again to comment. On the topic of planning, Cllr. Richard Munday and I will be meeting the Head of Planning at TVBC on 5th November to discuss the enforcement of planning permission at Thruxton Down Farm where we believe the owner is in breach of planning laws.

## **Thruxton Parish Council**

As usual, the Parish Council met on the first Monday of the month – 2nd October. The full minutes will appear on notice-boards and the Thruxton Village website but the key issues discussed covered the following points:

 It was decided to seek the advice of the Environment Agency, Wessex Rivers Trust and TVBC regarding the on-going maintenance of the stream and the bank to the stream alongside the Village Green. A working party has cleared away this year's growth but plans for next year will reflect the professional advice that we receive.

- Analyses and reports from the speed camera on Stanbury Road will be posted to the Thruxton Village website so that residents can see what data is being generated.
- Cllr. Cotterill has identified a first-aid training provider that will be more cost-effective than St. John's Ambulance and dates for the training will now be established.
- Planning:
  - an application to carry out tree works at Bridge Cottage was approved.
  - Cllrs. Christie and Munday will meet the TVBC Head of Planning (Simon Finch) on 5th October to discuss the enforcement of current planning permission at Thruxton Down Farm.
  - It was noted that the Northern Area Planning Committee had refused permission for the development of a solar farm at Lains Farm in Quarley.
- Community thanks were noted to the following for their hard work in the working parties to clear the stream: Stella Chandler, Suzie Cotterill, Tricia and Graham Harris, Joan Jackson, Richard Munday, Gill Odling and Beckie and Rob Sherlock. A very special thanks was also noted for Amelie Sherlock for supporting the stream clearance she's 2½ years old!

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be at 7:30pm on Monday 6th November in the Machin Room of the Memorial Hall – all residents are welcome to attend.


## What Makes Putin Tick? Friday 1st December 2023 7pm Thruxton Memorial Hall

Why did he invade Ukraine? A talk by AIR CHIEF MARSHAL SIR JOHN CHESHIRE

Sir John joined the Royal Air Force in 1961 and completed several flying appointments on the Hercules. He was then seconded to the Royal Brunei Air Force as the Commander of their Air Wing. He has held several staff appointments with the most prominent as the United Kingdom's Air Attache in Moscow in the late 1980s. Subsequently, he kept in touch with events in Russia in senior NATO appointments as the United Kingdom's representative to NATO, and in command of the Allied Forces Northwestern Europe – a Command with several countries bordering on Russia. After retirement from the Royal Air Force in 2000, Sir John was appointed Lieutenant Governor of Jersey from 2001 to 2006.
