From the Editor

Welcome to the October issue of the Thruxton parish newsletter. The last month has seen the onset of autumn and the first heavy rains. The Pilhill stream remains dry and now would be an ideal time to carry out the repairs to the damaged roadside bank by the green.

On the green side, the bank has partially collapsed and further exposed some unknown cables. We are still awaiting Hampshire Highways to undertake repairs after three years of chasing although we are told it is progressing. We have been engaging with TVBC along with a group of residents and identified addressing multiple issues around the stream as an area to focus on as part of a community engagement initiative. More on that in the coming months.

Along with the Jubilee committee's new entrance to the green project and the phone box/library refurbishment, we hope to secure and improve this public space for all to enjoy in the decades to come.

Last week, I accompanied a TVBC safety inspector to look at the play area on the Sports field. He identified the uncommissioned see-saw and the brick climbing structure outside the fenced area as safety risks. A parent spoke to us stating particular concern about the brick wall, having seen incidents there. A young parishioner also approached us to lobby for more swings, a future leader in the making!

We listened, and have agreed to take action to make equipment safe and look to fund improvements.

New housing in the area continues to be a controversial topic. Two new planning applications for twenty and fifteen houses along Dauntsey Lane have been submitted. These were discussed at our meeting and the Parish Council will submit our comments before the deadline of 16th October.

As always, we encourage residents to submit comments to TVBC Planning as these are a statutory consideration for any planning decision. These can be emailed to planning@testvalley.gov.uk.

The Application references are 25/02226/OUTN, 20 houses on the Western Side 25/02233/OUTN, 15 houses on the eastern side.

Parish Council October Meeting

The Parish Council met on Monday 6th October 2025 at 7pm in the Memorial Hall. There was a large attendance by the public standing room only! As usual full minutes will appear on Parish Notice Boards and the website but key issues discussed included:

- Hampshire Cllr Lashbrook was in attendance and stated that in response to the 2042 Draft Local Plan, the council had submitted Option 1 to the government, for re-organisation into a new Unitary Authority, which would combine TVBC with East Hampshire/Winchester and the New Forest as one Authority.
 - Cllr Lashbrook said Option 1 was considered a better fit for the residents in these rural areas, rather than combining with Southampton and Eastleigh.
- Mirrors on Halcyon Drive hedges are encroaching on these. Cllr Earp will follow this up.

- Collapse of the bank of the brook by the village green exposing cables. There was much discussion as to who would take the lead on getting this repaired as it involves various agencies. The chairman said he will action further with the authorities
- Two outline planning proposals have been received by TVBC to build 15 and 20 new houses either side of Dauntsey Lane, filling in the green spaces. There was a lengthy discussion on this and how it will affect current residents. Cllr Lashbrook urged residents to submit comments collectively with their objections. The Parish Council (PC) will be objecting to both of these plans.
- A member of the public asked what the PC would do about the regular flooding that occurs on Dauntsey Lane.
 Responsibility lies with Hampshire Highways. PC will follow up on this.
- Trees Cllr Cotterill and the Clerk had met with Darren Smith, Arboricultural Officer, Planning Services, TVBC, regarding the state of the trees on the village green, which are the responsibility of the parish council. He recommended that the parish has a full Arboreal Cultural Survey done – plotting every tree, to assess them and advise on how best they can be managed going forward.
- Play Area Cllr Odling provided a report on management of the Play Area, and in particular the safety of the existing equipment. At the moment the Seesaw has been disabled pending either removal or more safety features being added. Further discussions are needed on how the PC can resolve the ongoing problems of maintenance of the play area.

- A new notice board at the top of Stanbury Road has been ordered. As well, a new door for the telephone box library was approved. It was suggested that Thruxton Memorial Hall could be used whilst the box is being repaired. Cllr Odling will ask the Hall trustees.
- Thruxton Planning Forum Group a
 member of the public raised a query as
 to whether this should stay as an informal
 group rather than a formal
 sub-committee as it would change the
 nature of what they do to just advise
 the council and therefore not subject to
 attendance by public and press. Further
 information is being sought.
- The A342 group asked the PC if the Hall could be available for use occasionally for their meetings and whether the council would cover the costs of hire. This was agreed.
- Applications for funds from the Fete Committee to be put forward to the Fete committee first and then submitted to council.
- Cllr Munday thanked Cllr Cotterill for her time on the council and presented her with a card and gift voucher.
