Thruxton Parish Newsletter - April 2023

I hope you all enjoyed the Easter weekend and made the most of the glorious sunny weather that we had - for most of the time! I was occupied on a project in the garden so didn't have the time to finalise this month's Thruxton Times - hence the slightly delayed delivery. I hope you're not too disrupted by the later than usual circulation.

The most important event to highlight is the Local Election that will be held on Thursday 4th May - this is your chance to express your voice and vote for a Councillor to represent you on TVBC. Please remember to take along some form of photo ID which, for reasons known best to our Government, is now mandatory at all elections. Unfortunately, you won't get the chance to vote for the Parish Council as there were only 5 people standing for 7 seats - so all 5 candidates are automatically elected. The 5 Councillors are myself, John Davis, Tricia Harris, Richard Munday and Will Odling. It means that we have 2 places vacant for anyone who wishes to volunteer to be a Councillor; if you are interested, please contact me - pchristie@thruxtonparishcouncil.com. It also means that we say a fond farewell to Cllrs. Jo Durant and Janet Graham who have given fantastic service to the community during their times on the Council, especially in respect of our project to implement speed warning signs (thanks for all your hard work, Jo) and the custodian-ship of the Village Green (thanks to Janet for her commitment and energy in keeping the Green looking so pleasant).

Following the election of a new Parish Council, we will hold our AGM followed by the annual Parish Meeting on Wednesday 10th May. The AGM will start at 7:00pm and will be followed at 8:00pm by the Parish meeting. As is

traditional, there will be drinks and nibbles following the end of the Parish Meeting - probably about 9:15pm or so.

We have another environmental initiative later this month. Hugh McPartlin has taken up the baton of encouraging re-wilding in the Parish and has arranged a talk on Friday 21st April at 7:30pm from Ben Kite about how communities can set aside an area to be planted with wild flowers, thus encouraging natural flora and fauna. There's a separate piece in this newsletter with more information.

Planning remains relatively quiet but we continue to expect a revised planning application for the land off Stanbury Road. A small but dedicated team from the community have been working hard over several months to prepare for such an eventuality and our thanks go out to Steve Counsell, Mike Windsor, Hugh McPartlin and Edward and Louise Chamberlain for their work. They have

summarised all the objections raised to previous applications on this land and stand ready to steer our response to a future application.

Finally, we have been advised that Hampshire County Council have been successful in applying for an additional £6 million to repair potholes across the county – it is estimated that this will enable an additional 40,000 pothole repairs to be made. Obviously, the first step is knowing about the potholes, so if you see a pothole please register it on the dedicated web page at <https://www.hants.gov.uk/transport/roadmaintenance/roadproblems/potholes>

Parish Council Meeting

The current Council held it's last meeting on Wed. 5th April 2023 before being disbanded ahead of the Local Council elections in May. We had an uncontroversial agenda and the full minutes will appear on the Thruxton Village website and the notice boards, but the key points were as follows:

- Cllr. Munday reported that he continues to work on the biodiversity plan for the Parish and a survey of bird-life is currently being conducted.
- Cllr. Christie reported on the latest news on roads, including the planned re-surfacing of Thruxton Down in the summer and that we have requested that "slow" signs are added to the road surface.
- Cllr. Harris asked that the Council pass a vote of thanks to all the distributors of the newsletter, especially recognising their dedication through the cold and wet months of winter. Council unanimously agreed with the proposal.
- Cllr. Harris also offered to transport

people to Thruxton Loves Cake coffee mornings at the Memorial Hall should they need assistance.

- The Clerk reported that posts for the speed awareness signs have been installed and she was authorised to purchase 2 signs from a supplier, Elan City.
- The Clerk was also authorised to purchase new matting for the play area at the Sports Field; Ray Welsh has agreed to fit the mats when they have been delivered. Ray Welsh has also agreed to clear ground on the Village Green in preparation for planting new trees and shrubs near the main gate to the Green.
- The plans to re-surface St. John's Lane have been delayed due to recent wet weather; however, as soon as the surface dries out the work will start.
- The Council have been notified of 6 volunteers for First Aid training; we are awaiting additional volunteers from the surrounding communities.
- Councillors approved the end-of-year accounts which will now be sent for audit.
- Councillors agreed with a recommendation to file no objection to a planning application for tree works at Thruxton Manor.
- Councillors passed a vote of thanks for Cllr. Durant and Cllr. Graham for their service to the community during their time on the Council.

The meeting closed at 9:15pm. The next meeting – the AGM – will be held at 7:00pm on Wed, 10th May to be followed by the annual Parish Meeting.



Talk - Re-wilding parts of the village

We have now moved into spring which has brought with it the buzz of bees and the calls of nesting birds. The warmer evenings are bringing out bats and we've even had otters doing raids on garden ponds. We have some rich examples of chalk grasslands and wild flower meadows in and around the parish, such as in Thruxton Down and along Snoddington Lane. The village has a wealth of wildlife, all of which depend on these wild areas in our neighbourhood.

We now have a chance to add to the wildness in our neighbourhood by seeding some of the grassed areas in the village with appropriate wild seed, which, with a little work, can become wild flower/wildlife "no mow" zones.

Come to the talk and find out how, from Ben Kite who has been responsible in his spare time for organising planting of wild flower areas in and around Appleshaw Parish, including the Church Yard & Cemetery. What has been done in Appleshaw can be done here; all we need are some willing volunteers for a couple of mornings with spades, some grassed areas suitable for re-wilding and a bag full of the right seeds.

Ben is a Chartered Ecologist and environmental planner with expertise in Habitat Regulations/Appropriate Assessments, Environmental Impact Assessment, Strategic Environmental Assessment and Sustainability Appraisal. He is the MD of Ecological Planning & Research Ltd. Ben lives in Appleshaw and is a most engaging and interesting speaker.
