Thrupton Parish Newsletter - November 2022

Welcome once more to this month's Thrupton Times – with the clocks having fallen back last weekend it feels as if autumn is well and truly established and the dark evenings are rapidly creeping up on us. Given that it's the start of November, I'd like to open with a request for those planning Bonfire parties on and around 5th of the month to respect neighbours, pets and local wildlife by exercising consideration and great care in using fireworks and to seriously consider attendance at an organised gathering rather than having your own party. Having said that, I hope you and - especially - the children enjoy the ooohs and aaahs!

After all the work associated with responding to major planning applications earlier in the year, it has become a relatively quiet period for the Parish Council with few applications registered recently. Certainly, we've not received anything contentious and all the current applications are proceeding smoothly. We continue to make progress – albeit slightly slower than wished – on the installation of speed warning signs in the village but continue to look for volunteers to assist with the on-going support of the equipment. We are delighted to see that Richard and Dee Thorne have returned home to the village after 2 years away whilst Bridge Cottage was repaired following the devastating thatch fire. Welcome back and we hope the renovations are proceeding smoothly.

The Parish Council have been in discussion with our Hampshire County Councillor Chris Donnelly regarding improvements to the signage to discourage lorries from entering the village as well as improving drainage at the eastern end of the village. Cllr. Donnelly is taking up the cudgels to fight our corner with Hampshire Highways and, whilst these are both long-standing issues, hope springs eternal. Hampshire CC are also considering a plan to introduce 20 mph speed limits in

villages across the county; the Highways Select Committee is examining the proposal and will report back early in the New Year.

We were incredibly impressed to learn that the various events held to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee in early June raised an amazing total of £5,700 – a massive thanks to everyone who was involved in organising and running the different events. The team of people involved will meet during November to consider the best way to create a lasting commemoration of this historic celebration.

Finally, please be aware that the Parish Council have appointed tree surgeons to carry out work on the trees growing on various patches of Parish Council land, including the village green, the land by the post box on Lambourne Way and the land by the mile-post on Village Street. The work will be carried out during this month – it is hoped on 22nd Nov.

Parish Council Meeting – Wed. 2nd Nov. 2022

At our November monthly meeting the following items were discussed:

- Cllr. Munday reported on his work related to flood risk in the village and maintaining / enhancing bio-diversity across the Parish. The Parish Council are seeking volunteers to

act as Flood Wardens and any person interested should contact Richard Munday – rmunday@thruptonparishcouncil.com An Environment Agency leaflet will be distributed to all households that connect to the Pilhill Brook to remind them of their riparian ownership responsibilities. In the meantime, Cllr. Munday continues to develop a Flood Plan for Thruxton as well as preparing a bio-diversity status report for the Council.

- Cllr. Graham wished to thank Ray Welch for his maintenance work on Mandy Garden on the Village Green.
- Cllr. Odling has assumed responsibility for the monthly checks on the play equipment on the Sports Field and presented his report which identified a number of small maintenance and repair tasks to be completed to maintain safe operation. The Chair agreed to speak to some residents to seek their assistance with this.
- The Clerk reported on progress regarding the purchase and installation of speed warning signs. A final list of 5 preferred sites has been agreed and we are now in discussion with Hampshire Highways regarding the installation of posts on which the equipment will be mounted. The locations are the junction of Village St. and Church Rd., Village St. at the eastern entrance to the village, Stanbury Rd. near the bus stop, Stanbury Rd. near Elm Close junction and Stanbury Rd. close to St. Johns Lane junction.
- Community thanks were passed for the work done by Ray Welch around the village and especially clearing the Village Green of garden waste left there by person(s) unknown.
- The next meeting will be held on Wed. 7th December at 7:30 when the Chair and Vice Chair will share in the traditional mince pies and wine with Councillors and


