Welcome to this packed June edition of the Parish newsletter. We had a busy month in May, holding the **Annual Council Meeting and Annual Parish** Assembly; and the Parish Council meeting in June.

I became the Chairman of the Parish Council after Peter Christie stepped down last month. His many years good service is very much appreciated by the community.

The big news this month is the granting of a planning appeal for 14 homes on the land by Stanbury Close, overriding local concerns. The Parish Council had opposed the application particularly on the grounds of road impact and safety. There are however, many significant items to be covered before the developer is allowed to commence building. We are engaging with the developer and Planning to seek to influence and minimise adverse impacts where possible.

On a positive note, we agreed a £5,000 grant to the Memorial Hall towards a replacement kitchen. The Hall is at the heart of the community and an asset for all to use. Please see the back page for all their news.

Lastly, a plea on behalf of the Parish Council. The work of the council contributes to a thriving community. We are a friendly volunteer group who contribute a few hours per month to give a little back, ably supported by our part time clerk. Although we currently have five councillors, we desperately need new councillors to share the load. Please consider putting yourself forward by contacting me in the first instance. If you are thinking "someone should" on local issues, please remember you are someone.

Guest speakers were invited to the Annual Parish Assembly

Test Valley Borough Councillor Phil Lashbrook spoke on Devolution and the planned Unitary Authority. This will replace the borough councils and put a county mayor in place. It is the reason that was given for cancelling county council elections.

Cllr Lashbrook advised this will not be implemented until 2028 earliet but is already impacting the council who have to run existing services and plan the changes. For more information, contact Test Valley Borough Council www.testvalley.gov.uk

Annual Parish Assembly, Guest Speakers

TVBC Cllr Lashbrook stood in to explain the role of the TVBC Community Engagement Officer, Michelle Penn, who was unable to attend. The main responsibilities for such an officer are to provide a single point of contact for Ward Councillors and to provide a link to partner organisations and community networks. Ms Penn offered to come to a future meeting to speak to residents.

British Automobile Racing Club (BARC)

Ben Taylor, Group CEO, BARC, spoke about its community work with the school and Armed Services, and gave details about some of the scheduled events for the Circuit. New events include the retro weekend over the summer solstice weekend. The circuit owner could not attend the meeting but had reported plans including the rebuilding of the control tower; creating a new eatery and microbrewery; revitalisation of the industrial estate focussed on motor engineering and hopefully aircraft businesses; the planned return of fireworks at the circuit on 1 November and continued use of the dog walking field for Thruxton residents.

Public Participation

Questions were asked by the public and these are addressed in the draft Minutes, which will be on the parish website and noticeboards.

Traffic and Pedestrian Safety in Thruxton

The housing needs survey last year included questions on speed control and safety through the village. The responses received were strongly in support of reducing the speed limit and other potential measures.

Hedgehogs in your garden

Would you like to help the hedgehogs in the Village and encourage them into your garden? Here are a few tips, contributed by Gill Odling.

- Supplementary feeding gives hedgehogs a chance to eat when their usual meal proves difficult to hunt. The best food that you can leave out for hedgehogs is meat-based cat or dog food, (not fish based) or specially made hedgehog food from a wildlife retailer or crushed up cat biscuits. 'Human food' will upset their tummies and make a mess in your garden.
- As hungry as hedgehogs can be, there are a couple of things to avoid giving them.
 Although they're an insect, mealworms can cause health problems when eaten in large quantities so it's best to avoid them. Also avoid giving out bread as this is low in energy and has no nutritional value.

You could use an upturned storage box with a hole cut in the side for a tunnel, perhaps made from an old ridge tile. The tunnel stops other animals from eating the food. Another common misconception is giving them milk.

Hedgehogs are actually lactose intolerant so putting milk out for them will give them diarrhoea. Instead, consider creating a 'hedgehog hole' at the bottom of your garden fence to allow hedgehogs to move from garden to garden with ease; rewilding parts of your garden by constructing woodpiles and allowing areas to become overgrown. This will provide a natural source of food and shelter for them.

Also, don't clear away natural materials like twigs, dead leaves, feathers and hedge cuttings. If you see a hedgehog out in the day, it is really unusual and probably means it's not very well.

The Wiltshire Wildlife Hospital can give you advice and or take in poorly hedgehogs.
