You will see elsewhere in the newsletter update recent on applications and you may be interested in an update on the pending application for development of the field at the end of Lambourne Way. I understand that a pre-application was submitted to TVBC in October and they have proposed a number of changes to be made to the plans; these are in the process of being worked on by the developer and we expect a formal planning application to be submitted before Easter, at which point the Parish Council will convene a meeting for residents to share their views and opinions on the matter. Also, word on the grapevine is that the possible development of land behind Stanbury Close is still being considered - there has been no official application (or, indeed, any communication) from the developer but there remains a possibility of an application to build houses on this land. The solar farm development at Lains Farm is still progressing - we have been told that their planning application will be submitted later this month.

Plans for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee continue to develop – see page 4 in the newsletter for an update from the organising team, including details of an online murder mystery event on 21st

January being held to raise funds for the Jubilee weekend.

Finally, roadworks at Thruxton Down will continue over the coming 4 (yes, four) months – full details can be found at h t t p s: // o n e . n e t w o r k / ?tm=GB124335610 Please note that, between Mon. 24th January and Fri 25th March (9 weeks), the road from the A303 westbound off-slip into Quarley will be closed to through traffic.

A revised plan for work on an extension to Floral Villa has been submitted and the Parish Council will not raise any objection to the application.

Chris Goode

It is with great sadness that we record the death of Chris Goode, who died peacefully at home on December 28th. Bob Hodges, a close friend of Chris and Tessa, writes:

I have known Chris for 11 years, since he and Tessa moved to Thruxton, and a more friendly and generous man would be hard to find. He had many friends in the village and everyone who knew Chris commented on his generosity, reliability, humour and helpfulness; above all he was excellent company.

Chris joined the Royal Marines aged 18 and served from 1957 to 1974. He had a wide-ranging career with service in UK, Aden, Malta and the Far East. His love of sport was allowed full rein – he represented the Combined Services and the Royal Navy in both rugby and cricket. He was invalided out of the Royal Marines aged 36, due to injured knees. He was awarded an MBE in 1972 for services to Public Relations.

When he and Tessa retired from business in 2000 they moved to France, then moved to Thruxton in 2010, where they quickly settled into the community. He loved his garden, was a keen member of Thruxton Gardening Club and a loyal and generous supporter of Thruxton Loves Cake. He built strong friendships with many village residents.
